What is the 12 Step Call List?

It is a *confidential* list of Men and Women who are willing to do 12 step calls. This can be a simple phone call or a 12th step visit. The list specifies what you would be willing to do.



How it Works

- A volunteer manning the 24 hour phone service receives a call from someone in need.
- the volunteer determines the need of the individual.
- if a phone call/visit is warranted, the volunteer calls a man or woman from the 12 Step List (depending on the gender of the caller) and gives them the phone number of the caller.
- your number is not given to the caller by the volunteer.

Note: Phone calls can be handled individually but 12 step visits should be done in twos.

Qualifications

- Be an Alcoholic
- It is recommended that you have completed the 12 steps.
- Consultation with your sponsor.

Note: This service presents an outstanding opportunity for a sponsor to demonstrate to a sponsee how to perform 12 step calls.
