

What's CACYPAA?

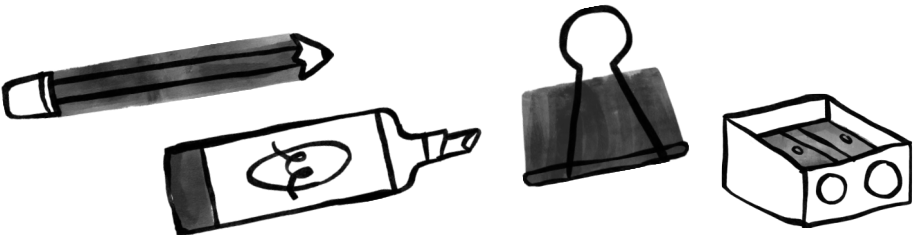
